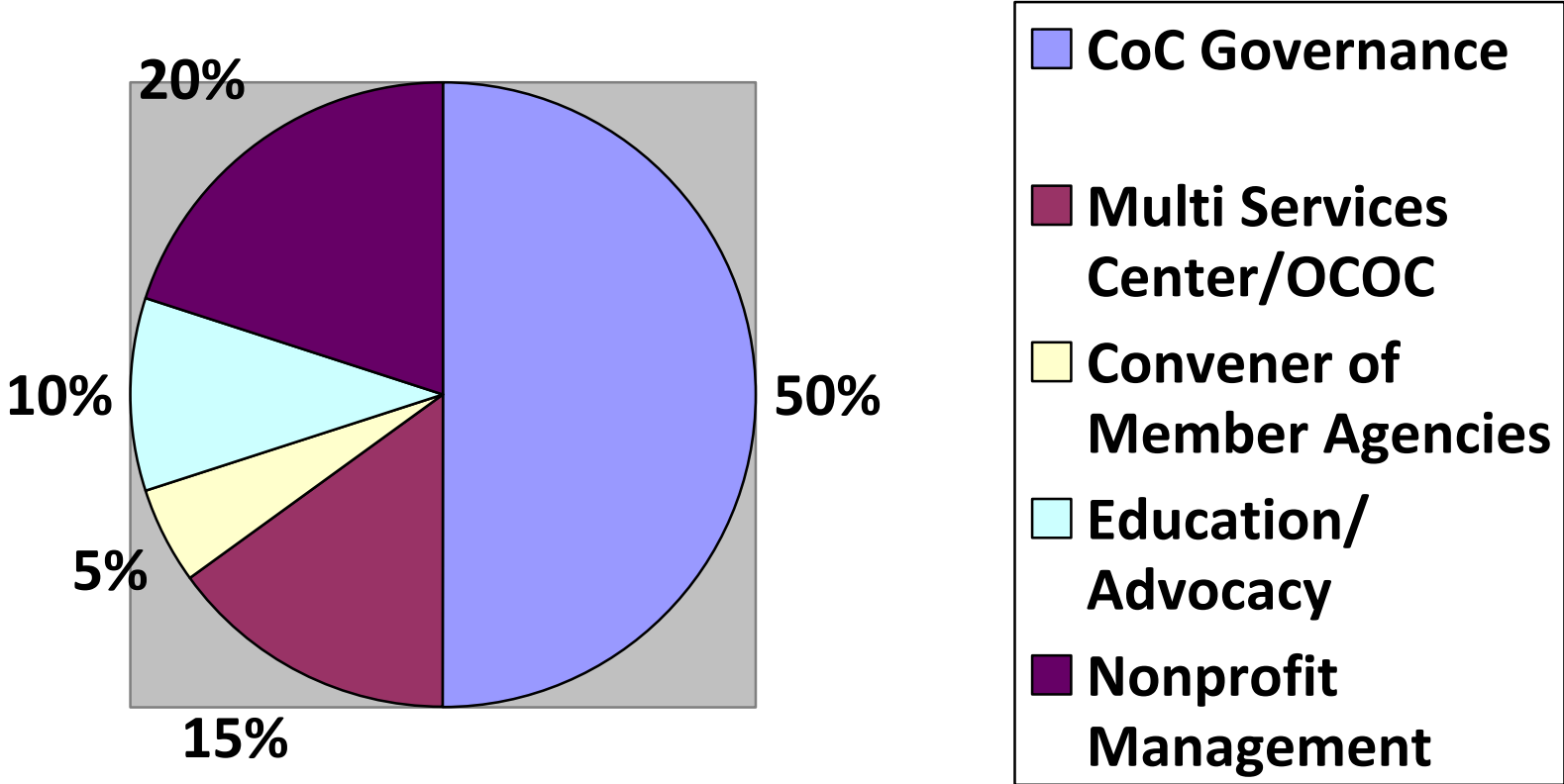


Functions of the Raleigh/Wake Partnership to End and Prevent Homelessness



The pie chart defines the role of the Partnership, not the Executive Director/staff. Historically, given capacity constraints, those identities have overlapped. However, given the growth of the Partnership staff and reach, many of these functions can be shared among staff, board members, committees, and even outsourcing.

As illustrated in the pie chart, half of the job of the Partnership is HUD-related and half is local community-related.

HUD-related (50%)

The CoC Governance role includes the HUD-related aspects: HMIS, Point in Time, AHAR, NOFA, ESG, eSNAPS, board training/staffing, etc.

Community-related (50%)

Convener of Member Agencies includes getting partners together to discuss community-specific challenges such as diversion, White Flag, affordable housing, and landlords. It includes membership meetings.

Multiservice Center/OCOC refers to all activities around planning for the Center and the services provided at OCOC. It also includes interface with the City, the County and Catholic Charities, and talking with potential partners.

Education/Advocacy means talking to groups to build awareness, motivate engagement, and advocate for positive community change.

Nonprofit Management includes fund development for the Partnership's budget, board development, staff training and supervision, effective communication, maintaining adequate and current financial records, and the daily activities that keep an office running (go to post office, order supplies, pay bills).
