2018 Continuum of Care Program

Service Area: Wake County

The Wake County Continuum of Care is the legal entity charged by US Department of Housing and Urban Development to submit the community-wide application for homeless assistance funds. The 2018 federal competition is anticipated to commence in June 2018. Agencies considering applying must clearly demonstrate their ability to successfully meet Continuum of Care program outcomes in one or more of the activity areas as outlined in the Homeless Emergency Assistance and Rapid Transition to Housing: Continuum of Care Program; Interim Final Rule (24 CFR Part 578 [Docket No. FR-5476-I-01]). Information Session

The Wake County Continuum of Care will hold a required information session for agencies who are considering submitting an application for Continuum of Care Program funds on Thursday, June 14, 2018 at 2:00 P.M. in the community room of CASA's Robertson Hill apartment complex located at 1725 Poole Road. This is a threshold requirement for participation in the 2018 competition and good source of information for agencies who anticipate submitting applications in future years.

CoC Program Goals

- ✓ Promote communitywide commitment to the goal of ending homelessness.
- ✓ Provide funding for efforts by nonprofit providers and State and local governments to quickly rehouse homeless individuals and families while minimizing the trauma and dislocation caused to homeless individuals, families and communities by homelessness.
- ✓ Promote access to and utilization of mainstream programs by homeless individuals.
- ✓ Optimize self-sufficiency among individuals and families experiencing homelessness.

Who can apply for this funding?

Due paying member agencies of the Partnership to End and Prevent Homelessness participating in a majority of the membership meetings for the year prior to submitting an application in a competition.

Service Area

Agencies/organizations who serve persons residing in Wake County may apply for funding.

Target Population

The target population is persons who meet the HUD definition of homelessness. [(1) Individuals and families who lack a fixed, regular, and adequate nighttime residence and includes a subset for an individual who resided in an emergency shelter or a place not meant for human habitation and who is exiting an institution where he or she temporarily resided for 90 days or less; (2) individuals and families who will imminently- within 14 days -lose their primary nighttime residence; (3) unaccompanied youth and families with children and youth who are defined as homeless under other federal statutes who do not otherwise qualify as homeless under this definition, have not had permanent housing during the past 60 days, have experienced persistent instability, and can be expected to continue in such status for an extended period of time; and (4) individuals and families who are fleeing, or are attempting to flee, domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, stalking, or other dangerous or life-threatening conditions that relate to violence against the individual or a family member.]

Eligible Activities

The following activities may be performed with CoC Program funds: (1) Permanent Housing; (2) Transitional Housing; (3) Supportive Services Only. Please refer to the HUD exchange website and HUD Certifications 24CFR578 for detailed information and other eligibility requirements.
